Funding for Innovation in Automotive Businesses

The Minister for Industry, Science and Technology, Karen Andrews, announced a new initiative today worth \$7 million dollars to support Australia's automotive sector by assisting local businesses expand into new markets.

Minister Andrews said, "The Coalition Government is committed to supporting an internationally competitive and globally integrated automotive sector in Australia."

The Automotive Innovation Lab Access Grants program will support businesses across Australia to undertake automotive product development. Businesses can receive up to \$200,000 in matched funding for eligible project costs. Eligible project costs can include design, prototype and testing activities at established commercial and research facilities and automotive innovation labs.

Dr Brett Dale, Group CEO for the Motor Trades Association of Queensland said, "This is a great opportunity for automotive businesses in Queensland to utilise the services of our innovation hub – MTAiQ – Australia's first purpose-built facility for the industry which has been operating for over a year. We have a vast array of clients in the hub, from start-up companies and individual entrepreneurs, to offshore micro-manufacturing businesses looking to scale up."

This is a tremendous initiative and we welcome the financial assistance for Queensland automotive businesses to move into new areas of growth. We have also recently announced

our support for the Automotive Engineering Graduate Program, which will encourage qualified engineers into the Australian automotive industry."
