Joshua in the Running for Apprentice of the Year

Recently qualified Certificate III Heavy Commercial Vehicle Mechanical Technology apprentice Joshua Middlebrook, from BMAS Biloela, has been recognised for his skills and dedication to the automotive trades by being named a finalist for the Motor Trades Association of Queensland's (MTA Queensland) 2021 Apprentice of the Year award.

Since beginning his apprenticeship four years ago, Joshua has more than lived up to the BMAS Biloela workshop motto of 'do it once, do it well', having completed a Light Vehicle Apprenticeship, qualified as an Approved Examiner, gained his Automotive Air Conditioning License, and become a Massey Ferguson trained technician.

The illustrious Apprentice of the Year award is presented to an MTA Institute student who has displayed excellence and passion and has gone above and beyond in their commitment to training. The Apprentice of the Year will be crowned at the MTA Queensland Industry Awards Gala on Saturday, 20th November in Brisbane.

With over 2,200 apprentices currently training at the MTA Institute, the award is hotly contested and remains the highlight of the annual signature event hosted by MTA Queensland.

The 2021 winner will take home a 218-piece automotive starter toolkit, valued at \$3,299 thanks to Milwaukee Tool, who has partnered as the official tool sponsor for the award. Each finalist will not leave empty handed as Milwaukee Tool will supply

the runners-up with a socket set valued at \$499. The winner will also be treated to a two-week work experience opportunity at Triple Eight Race Engineering.
