MTA Queensland Welcomes Ignite Ideas Funding

On Saturday, the Palaszczuk Government announced how their Advance Queensland funding for the Ignite Ideas Program is achieving great results in assisting small businesses to bring their innovative products to market.

Minister for Innovation, Science and the Digital Economy and Minister for Small Business, The Honourable Leeanne Enoch said, "So far, 119 businesses throughout the state have shared in close to \$16.5 million funding from the program.

"Because many startups and businesses can struggle with developing early-stage ideas due to lack of funding support and dedicated development focus, we are giving them a financial helping hand."

Minister Enoch said Brisbane's Elevare Energy is achieving great results turning a 'smart idea into smart batteries' which will help businesses reduce electricity costs.

MTA Queensland member, Llewellyn Motors, is the first of 10 customers to trial the smart battery over six months at their Toyota, Holden, Hyundai and Subaru dealerships in Ipswich.

"We are pleased to be part of this innovation and thank the Queensland Government for their support to reduce our commercial energy costs and carbon footprint," said General Manager James Sturges.

This funding can make a real difference to the constantly-evolving automotive sector, as we head toward an innovation revolution resulting from a significant digital disruption in all areas of the value chain.

Dr Brett Dale, Group Chief Executive for MTA Queensland said, "Llewellyn Motors have acted on an enormous opportunity to reduce the costs associated with their business by using an innovation product that utilises smart battery management technology.
