## MTA Queensland Supports Public Education Around Petrol Tax

The government will soon commission a study into moving to road-user charge, where motorists would be charged for every kilometre they drive, replacing the existing petrol excise and registration fees.

Minister for Urban Infrastructure, Paul Fletcher, announced this week that this move would require a public information campaign because many motorists have no idea they even pay petrol tax.

MTA Queensland Group CEO, Dr Brett Dale, said, "We strongly support a public consultation campaign, if motorists were going to accept a road-user charge, they need to fully understand the current system and how proposed changes may impact on them.

"The public may have a different view of petrol pricing and service station operators if they were more aware of the breakdown of the components in supplying petrol. The largest component of the price is the refined fuel itself, making up about 40%. Add on the government fuel excise and wholesale GST of approximately 40%, the wholesale margin of approximately 10% and that leaves approximately 10% for the retailer.

"One way that the government could start educating the public is to itemise the fuel excise separately on their receipts."

Mr Fletcher stated that any move to a user-charge for vehicles was at least a decade away and would need the approval of all the states.
