MTA Queensland Welcomes Expanded Apprentice Subsidy Support

The Morrison Government yesterday announced they would be expanding and extending the Boosting Apprenticeship Commencements wage subsidy to support more Australian businesses in taking on new apprentices and trainees.

The subsidy was expanded after the Government's original \$1.2 billion investment in supporting 100,000 apprentices was overwhelmingly exhausted in just five months, resulting in the cap on places under the program being lifted.

Through the expanded subsidy, any business that engages an apprentice or trainee before 30 September 2021 may be subsidised 50 per cent of the apprentice or trainees wage, up to \$7,000 per quarter. The subsidy will be paid for a full 12-month period, from the date of commencement and includes apprentices who have already been signed up.

MTA Group CEO, Rod Camm, said "MTA Queensland supports the Government's decision to expand the apprentice wage subsidy, which will deliver opportunities for new apprentices and trainees looking for a start in the automotive industry and will provide confidence to businesses deciding whether or not it is feasible to put on a new apprentice in the current climate.

Background:
