Excellence Recognised as MTA Queensland Announces 2021 Industry Award Winners

Business owners, entrepreneurs, and apprentices from across Queensland have been recognised for their excellence and commitment to the Queensland automotive industry at the 2021 Motor Trades Association of Queensland (MTA Queensland) Industry Awards Gala on Saturday, 20th November.

Highlighting the incredible achievements of MTA Queensland members and MTA Institute apprentices over the last 12 months, the 2021 Industry Awards saw a record number of nominations submitted.

Fourth-year light vehicle mechanical apprentice **Joshua Frampton** from Cricks Maroochydore was crowned MTA Queensland Apprentice of the Year, taking out the much coveted award from a highly credentialed field of finalists.

It was a momentous occasion for the 26-year-old, who is quickly closing in on completing his apprenticeship with the Cricks Auto Group, where he has already experienced working with numerous makes and models during his short time in the industry.

A keenly determined individual, Joshua has set his sights firmly on opening a mechanical and restoration business of his own in the future, a goal he has had since high school.

"I would like to thank Andrew Seeley, from Cricks at Maroochydore, for dealing with me for the past four years. I know I haven't been the easiest apprentice to deal with, but I have always been out there trying and trying to achieve some great things," said Joshua. "I want to say thank you to my parents for supporting me and getting me to this stage – I really appreciate it. And I want to say a big thank you to my partner for being my rock and supporting me through this, and I am going to cherish this moment for a very long time. I hope to extend my experience into the community and motivate the next generation of automotive apprentices."

Fionna Blackburne, owner of Southeast Auto Mechanical in Beenleigh, was named winner of the Women in Industry Award for her commitment to educating women in the community on basic vehicle maintenance skills and principles through the 'Women on the Move' program.

Fionna's business took out the Community Award back in 2018 and she has continued to expand education programs in recent times, taking them to local schools and universities, while continuing to be an advocate for the many employment opportunities available to women in the automotive industry.

In the evening's other award categories, **Bill Robertson Toyota** in Gladstone was awarded the Community Award for their long-standing support of the Gladstone and Central Queensland communities, while **Electric Mobility Solutions Australia** (EMoS Australia) took out the Innovation Award.

MTA Group CEO Rod Camm said, "The MTA Queensland Industry Awards provides the perfect opportunity to acknowledge the individuals and businesses who are making exceptional contributions to the betterment of the industry through community and innovation leadership, and excellence in their discipline. We are privileged to be able to celebrate them in person at such a spectacular event.
