When Ford introduced the first Model T automobile to market in 1908, it transformed the way we moved and lived. Fast forward to today, we are now in the midst of the largest transition of mass transportation since the industrial revolution – the transition to electric.

Things are changing fast in the electric vehicle (EV) space, with major manufacturers publicly announcing their ambitions to transition to all-electric model line-ups. Global brands including Ford, Nissan, and Renault are aiming for a large percentage of their sales to be battery electric by the end of this decade, while luxury car makers such as Jaguar, Volvo, and Mercedes-Benz are aiming to go electric-only by the same deadline.

Support from environmentally conscious consumers is driving this shift, as is global government mandates aimed at reducing greenhouse gas emissions through EV adoption. Consumers can now buy the latest EV for under \$40,000, and as more models follow, there will be some real competition over the most competitively priced. With the range of EVs improving every day, it is no surprise that the number registered in Queensland has increased by 466 per cent over the last 3 years, and we now have just under 25,000 registered EVs on our roads.

Regardless of whether you believe the future is electric or not... it is already here.

The transition from internal combustion engines to electric changes everything, including the role of automotive service and repair businesses. International case examples suggest that revenue from servicing an EV is 42 per cent lower than the internal combustion engine equivalent. Businesses will need to think carefully about their next move in this fast-changing environment.

Being ahead of the game and working out a strategy for your business's future is critical. Now is the time to start planning.
