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Franchising Code of Conduct Reforms Welcomed

Major reforms to the Franchising Code of Conduct were announced by the Australian Government on 1 June 2021, which are warmly welcomed by the automotive industry and will result in greater equity between franchisees and franchisors.

The much-anticipated reforms are an important step towards getting a better balance of power in the franchising sector, with significant improvements for new car dealer franchisees in relation to disclosure, coverage, adequacy of terms to secure a return on investment, dispute resolution, and compensation requirements.

Further positive developments were announced yesterday, with the implementation of a 'class exemption' that provides exclusion from competition law for small businesses to collectively bargain with customers or suppliers, without them having to apply to the Australian Competition & Consumer Commission (ACCC).

The class exemption allows:

- businesses with an aggregated turnover of less than \$10 million in the financial year prior, to form or join a bargaining group to collectively bargain with customers or suppliers, and
- franchisees and fuel retailers to collectively bargain with their franchisor or fuel
 wholesaler respectively, regardless of their size, provided the group lodges a onepage notice with the ACCC and with each target business it proposes to
 collectively bargain with.

MTA Queensland CEO, Rod Camm said, "This is great step forward for our businesses operating franchised new car dealerships and service stations. The process is much simpler and allows for specific protections, resulting in a fairer playing field when negotiating commercial agreements."
