Driving a Sustainable Future for the Automotive Industry

The Motor Trades Association of Queensland (MTA Queensland) has today unveiled its 2024 State Election Blueprint, outlining critical support measures for the retail, repair, and service sectors of Queensland's automotive industry.

The automotive industry serves as a key enabler of the Queensland economy and is deeply intertwined with the lives of residents and businesses. Whether it's commuting to work, driving children to school, utilising light and commercial vehicles for trade purposes, or relying on trucks and mobile plant and equipment in the mining, construction, agricultural, or transport sectors, the automotive industry plays a vital role in keeping Queensland moving.

As the state election approaches on 26 October 2024, MTA Queensland's Blueprint highlights five strategic priorities designed to bolster the resilience and competitiveness of automotive businesses in Queensland.

Key recommendations from the Blueprint include:

- addressing skills shortages and developing workforce solutions to ensure the industry has the future skills to support Queensland's ongoing prosperity
- delivering high-quality training for an industry that is beginning to undergo a significant transformation
- shoring up future industry viability and competitiveness
- ensuring Queensland's transition to zero and low emission is optimised
- protecting the environment through adoption of end-of-life vehicle planning.

Queensland's automotive landscape is currently undergoing a significant transformation, driven by a rapid transition to zero and low emission vehicles. This transition presents multifaceted challenges across the automotive industry, particularly for family-owned businesses that are pivotal in vehicle maintenance and services.

"Developed through extensive consultations with members and industry stakeholders, MTA Queensland's State Election Blueprint offers practical recommendations to support automotive businesses during this time of transition," said Rod Camm, CEO of MTA Queensland.

"The sector's significant contribution necessitates a strategic relationship between the industry and government. We encourage all political parties to consider the proposals outlined in the Blueprint, and look forward to collaborating with the incoming government, opposition, and crossbench members to promote a sustainable future for the automotive industry."
